





BOP's Emergency Response

Every institution is like a small city and to cope with major emergencies or other significant interruptions of normal operations, they each have continuity of operations (COOP) plans that provide guidance to staff.



BOP's COVID-19 Response

In February 2020, the BOP's Public Health Service (PHS) staff were placed in operational dress uniforms to be ready to respond to COVID-19 incidents by the Assistant Secretary for Health.



BOP's COVID-19 Collaboration Efforts

BOP PHS Officers have been deployed for national travel-related screening at airports and NIC has been asked to share BOP-related guidance with state and local corrections.

COVID-19 Cases

The BOP has **142,446** federal immates in BOP-managed institutions and **10,447** in community-based facilities. The BOP staff complement is approximately **36,000**. As of 04/28/2020, there are **1314 federal immates** and **335 BOP staff** who have confirmed positive text results for COVID-19 nationwide. Currently, **404** inmates and **132** staff have recovered. There have been **30** federal immate deaths and **0** BOP staff member deaths attributed to COVID-19 disease. **Full breakdown and additional details...**

BOP began immediately reviewing all inmates who have COVID-19 risk factors, as described by the CDC, to determine which inmates are suitable for home confinement. Since the release of the Attorney General's original memo to the Bureau of Prisons on March 26, 2020 instructing us to prioritize home confinement as an appropriate response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the BOP has placed an additional 1,751 inmates on home confinement; an increase of **61.4** percent.
