SUBJECT: COVID-19 Booking Procedures and Medical Screening

Effective immediately, which shall be in effect until superseded by the U.S. Marshal, all new arrests will be booked at a United States Marshals Service (USMS) approved detention facility to receive a minimum of one medical screening prior to their presentation to the Court for an Initial Appearance. While conducting the medical screening at the detention facility by medical personnel, or by an approved medical professional outside of those facilities, a determination will be made as to the health suitability of the individual. If the individual does not pass the screening protocols set forth during the COVID-19 pandemic they will not be authorized to be transported to a District of Arizona (D/AZ) United States Courthouse. The USMS will continue to assist the D/AZ Court Family and partners in finding suitable alternatives for hearings and legal proceedings or materials for those individuals not cleared. Once an individual is cleared for transport, either by initial screening or following a successful quarantine and observation period, they will be presented to the Court without unnecessary delay.

To ensure a smooth booking process on federally detained individuals at an approved facility please coordinate with the D/AZ USMS Enforcement Supervisor(s) within the region where the U.S. District of Arizona Courthouse is located. We anticipate that as this pandemic continues the facilities authorized for curtesy holds may change and the USMS staff can assist in guiding these efforts. All D/AZ USMS Cellblocks will be closed during this period for processing and booking of detained individuals unless coordinated and authorized in advance. Furthermore any self-surrender directed arrests should be coordinated in advance with USMS supervisory staff in addition to onsite arrest requests. We ask that you communicate these temporary business practice changes to your staff as these efforts follow sound protocols to reduce exposure of illness and protect all parties involved.
