GENERAL ORDER NO. 2022-06

In accordance with the guidance provided by the Administrative Office of the United States Courts in a memorandum dated February 17, 2021, courts were advised that the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) would discontinue accepting paper records at its Federal Records Center (FRC) facilities beginning in January 2023. As a result, the permanent/historically significant records listed below, currently housed in Lincoln, are eligible for direct transfer to NARA pursuant to the *Guide to Judiciary Policy*, Vol. 10, Ch. 6, Appx. 6B: Records Disposition Schedule 2:

- (1) Lincoln and North Platte civil cases filed between 1972– 2006.
- (2) Lincoln criminal cases filed in 2002.
- (3) Cases deemed historically significant filed between 1973- 1975.
- (4) Lincoln docket and judgment books.

The Archivist of the United States has approved the deposit of the above records at the Lenexa Federal Records Center in Lenexa, Kansas.
