ORDER VACATING JULY 30, 2021 COVID-19 MASK ORDER

On July 30, 2021, the undersigned entered a COVID-19 Order requiring every person age four or over to wear a mask to enter a United States courthouse within the Middle District of Florida. In light of the current COVID situation and in consultation with the Court's COVID Committee, the July 30, 2021 COVID-19 Order (Doc. 4) is **VACATED**. Masks are no longer required to be worn by visitors or employees in Middle District of Florida courthouses. However, the presiding judge retains discretion to require masks in a court proceeding, and anyone who wishes to wear a mask in a courthouse may continue to do so.
