**To Prospective Jurors:** We in the federal judiciary know how difficult the last year has been. The federal courts in the Southern District of Texas have continued working throughout, but until recently, we have been unable to hold jury trials. Because the delay affects important rights, it is urgent that we resume trials as quickly as possible. We can't do that without you.

The judges in each of the seven divisions in the Southern District are deciding when to resume jury trials in that division, based on local conditions. Safety is our top priority. Because community conditions differ, each division is separately deciding when to resume jury trials.

To view the precautions that have been put in place to protect the health and safety of the jurors, the parties, the lawyers, and the court staff during jury selection and jury trials, please refer to the letter you received with your summons or visit the court's webpage for Jurors and the Divisional Office link for your local courthouse.
