ADDENDUM TO PROTOCOLS FOR REOPENING COURTHOUSES AND RESUMING NORMAL OPERATIONS

REVISED COVID-19 VACCINATION AND TESTING POLICY

Effective September 27, 2021, in light of the recent surge of COVID-19 cases in Mississippi, particularly Delta variant cases, and Mississippi's status as an area of high or substantial transmission for COVID-19, consistent with the Safer Federal Workforce Task Force's COVID-19 Model Workplace Safety Principles, recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and guidance from the Administrative Office of the United States Courts:

- All employees and on-site contractors must provide proof of vaccination against
 COVID-19 or be tested twice weekly for COVID-19.
- 2. Any employee or on-site contractor who fails to provide proof of vaccination against COVID-19 or proof of a negative COVID-19 test result will not be permitted to enter Northern District Court buildings or Northern District Court events.
- 3. Employees and on-site contractors who fail to provide proof of vaccination or who decline to provide their vaccination status will be considered unvaccinated.
- 4. On Monday and Thursday of each week, unvaccinated employees and unvaccinated on-site contractors must provide proof that they have been tested for COVID-19 within the prior three days.¹ Proof of COVID-19 test results must be provided to an appropriate supervisor or other

¹ If entering the building on a day other than Monday or Thursday, proof of a negative test result within the prior three days must be provided. If proof of a negative test taken on a Monday is provided the day it is taken, proof of a subsequently taken negative test must be provided the following Thursday.

designated person and may be submitted electronically. Test results from home-test or self-test kits are not acceptable unless indicated otherwise.

- 5. Visitors who are not fully vaccinated or decline to provide their vaccination status must provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test from no later than the three previous days prior to entering a Northern District Court building. This requirement does not apply to members of the public entering a Northern District Court building to obtain or provide a public service or benefit. Visitors who are attorneys, case participants, or witnesses entering a Northern District Court building for in-person scheduled court proceedings should contact the chambers of the presiding judge beforehand regarding application of this requirement.
- 6. This policy is revised and effective as of March 1, 2022. It may be further revised and shall remain in place until further notice.
