RESTRICTED PUBLIC ACCESS TO RUDMAN COURTHOUSE AND CLEVELAND FEDERAL BUILDING **ADM-1 ORDER 23-12**

ORDER

Due to the continuing public health and safety issues resulting from Coronavirus Disease 2019 and SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes the disease)—which we refer to simply as "COVID-19"—the United States District Court for the District of New Hampshire issues the following order restricting public access.

Effective immediately, the following people shall not enter the Rudman Courthouse or the Cleveland Federal Building:

- Persons who are currently experiencing any symptoms consistent with COVID-19, unless you tested negative on the day you enter the building.
- Persons who have recently tested positive for COVID-19, unless:
 - o you test negative, OR
 - o at least 10 days have passed since you tested positive.
- Persons who have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital or health agency within the past 10 days.

The court has rapid testing available. If you have a reason to enter the Rudman Courthouse but fall into one of the above categories, you may contact the clerk's office to discuss your circumstances and the possibility of using a rapid test (administered by the court) to determine your admissibility.

The presiding judge has the discretion to require case participants and persons within the courtroom to wear a mask that covers their noses and mouths. The court will provide a mask for those who do not have their own. A presiding judge who requires masking may also permit removal of masks by case participants who obtain a negative result from a rapid test administered by the court.

The presiding judge has the discretion to require case participants and persons within the courtroom to maintain a six-foot distance between themselves and others.

Anyone attempting to enter in violation of these protocols, or who decline to identify themselves upon request, will be denied entry or asked to vacate the courthouse by court security officers.

These access restrictions have been imposed pursuant to 41 C.F.R. § 102-74.375(b).

This order supersedes the court's order on Restricted Access to Rudman Courthouse and Cleveland Federal Building, ADM-1, 22-6, dated March 16, 2022, and takes effect April 7, 2023.
