



COVID-19 BUILDING REQUIREMENTS

- **TEMPERATURE AND SYMPTOM CHECK:** All persons are required to check temperature and symptoms at the building entrance. By entering the building, all persons certify that:
 - They do not have symptoms of COVID-19: temperature of 100.4 degrees or more, chills, cough, difficulty breathing, unusual fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion, nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea.
 - They are not subject to isolation or quarantine under CDC guidelines.
- **FACE COVERINGS:** All persons are required to wear masks in public and shared common areas and adhere to office or chambers mask requirements within court or agency space.
- **SOCIAL DISTANCING:** All persons are required to maintain 6 feet of social distance in public and shared common areas whenever possible and adhere to office or chambers distancing requirements within court or agency space.
- **PROOF OF VACCINATION OR NEGATIVE TESTING REQUIRED BY COURT OF APPEALS:** For court of appeals space, proof of full vaccination is required, defined as follows: two weeks after the second dose of the Pfizer, Moderna, or Novavax vaccine or a single dose of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. Absent proof of full vaccination, proof of a negative COVID-19 test taken no more than 72 hours before entry is required. This requirement does not apply to contractors or persons making deliveries to the court. For assistance, call the Clerk's Office at (804) 916-2700.
