Court Operations Under the Exigent Circumstances Created by the Coronavirus (COVID-19)

GENERAL ORDER NO. 2021-5

This General Order is being issued pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2071(e) and in response to the evolving public health crisis caused by the outbreak of the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19). The measures outlined in this General Order will serve as an extension of the efforts established in previous General Orders of this Court, intended to parallel the mandates issued by Washington State Governor Inslee, mitigate and slow the spread of COVID-19, and ensure the safety of litigants, counsel, Court staff, grand jurors, petit jurors, witnesses, and the public.

Accordingly, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED**, effective **April 1, 2021**, that the United States Courthouses for the Eastern District of Washington (Spokane, Richland and Yakima, Washington) will reopen to the public, with the Center of Disease Control's (CDC) health and safety precautions in place.

Therefore, IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT, effective immediately:

- 1. All Spokane and Yakima grand jury sessions shall PROCEED AS SCHEDULED, absent further Order of this Court.
- 2. As to pending criminal cases (District Court and Magistrate Court), the Court finds that the continued use of videoconferencing or telephone conferencing when necessary results in minimizing undue risk to defendants, counsel, law enforcement, Court staff, witnesses, and the public at large. Accordingly, the Court will continue to encourage and use these tools for those hearings allowed by General Order 20-101-3, 20-101-3 Extended, and the CARES Act, Pub. L. No. 116-136, when ordered by the presiding judge. The live audio content of these hearings will be available in real-time to members of the public and press, via a dedicated teleconference line. Dial-in information will be available on the PACER system in the docket of each scheduled case that is not held in open court. Hearing content provided in such manner must NOT be recorded or rebroadcast.
- 3. In light of the recent pattern of sustained decrease in COVID-19 transmission rates in the Eastern District of Washington, jury trials may resume inperson, subject to the presiding judge's discretion, beginning **April 1, 2021**. The Court will employ a cautious, phased-in approach to the resumption of jury trials, ensuring the effectiveness of deployed health and safety measures for each of the jury trials held.

The District Court Executive is directed to post this General Order to the Court's website and distribute a copy to each attorney registered in the CM/ECF system and each pro se litigant with a case pending before this Court.

This Order is subject to public comment by directing all concerns to the District Court Executive.
