and safety, the Court has cancelled all naturalization ceremonies through the end of September 2020 and delegated authority to the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services ("USCIS") to administer the oath of citizenship to applicants scheduled to be naturalized at those ceremonies, see General Order Nos. 20-09, 20-08; 

Therefore, because of the continued need to protect public health and safety due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Court orders as follows:

Until further notice, the Court will not schedule or conduct any 1. naturalization ceremonies.

2. During this temporary suspension of the Court's naturalization ceremonies, the Court grants USCIS authority to perform administrative naturalization ceremonies.
