

**ORDER ENDING AMENDED  
TEMPORARY GENERAL ORDER  
2020-05**

On March 30, 2020, I issued Temporary General Order 2020-05 to authorize the use of video and telephone conferencing under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act"). On March 25, 2022, I issued a new version of that order—Amended Temporary General Order 2020-05 (the "Amended Order")—which was effective for 90 days, or until June 23, 2022. I then extended the Amended Order four times. However, with the recent passage of Public Law No. 118-3, the Court's authority to use video and teleconferencing technologies in certain criminal proceedings under § 15002(b) of the CARES Act will expire on Wednesday, May 10, 2023. Accordingly, as Chief Judge, and under Section 15002(b)(1) of the CARES Act, I hereby limit the effective period of the Amended Order such that it ends on May 10, 2023. At the end of that day, the Amended Order will terminate.
