IN RE: ENTRY REQUIREMENTS IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19 Standing Order 2022-23

The following persons shall not enter any United States Courthouse in the District of Oregon:

- Persons who have tested positive for COVID-19 and who have not been fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) and whose symptoms are not improving;
- Persons who have tested positive for COVID-19, who do not have symptoms, and are within the five-day isolation period following the first full day after an initial positive test;
- iii. Persons who are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 and have not received results from a test since the onset of symptoms; and
- iv. Persons who have been asked to self-isolate or self-quarantine by a medical professional or public health authority and whose isolation or quarantine period has not concluded.

Persons who tested positive five days prior to arrival (with day 1 as the first full day after the positive test) and who are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) may enter the building after day 5, even in the absence of a negative test.

Although masks are optional in the public areas of the district courthouses, visitors are asked to follow mask recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that apply to them. With respect to courtrooms and adjacent spaces, a judge may determine whether to require individuals to wear a mask. Standing Order 2022-20 is vacated.

The United States Marshal, his deputies, and the Court Security Officers shall enforce this Order and deny entry to anyone attempting to enter in violation of this Order.
