**NOVEMBER 18, 2020 TEMPORARY GENERAL ORDER AUTHORIZING
GRAND JURY TO SIT THROUGH MARCH 2021**

Given the state of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, including the continued need to protect grand jurors, court employees, and witnesses from being exposed to the COVID-19 virus, and considering the need for federal grand juries to continue to meet, the court authorizes up to two grand jury sessions to be held per month through the end of March 2021, with appropriate mitigation measures in place.

If a grand jury sits during a day when the courthouse is closed, the United States Marshals Service shall permit courthouse entry to grand jurors and others with grand jury business such as witnesses, attorneys, court reporters, and interpreters, and shall permit entry to members of the public for the purpose of attending any return of indictment(s) by the grand jury.
