IN RE: ACCESS TO THE CLERK'S OFFICE AND FURTHER MODIFICATIONS OF COURT OPERATIONS UNDER THE EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES CREATED BY COVID-19 AND RELATED CORONAVIRUS

THIRD AMENDED TEMPORARY GENERAL ORDER 2020-04

In response to the outbreak of the coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") in the District of Nevada, the Court issued a series of general orders changing how the Court operated to do its part in containing the spread of COVID-19. See Temporary General Orders 2020-02, 2020-03, 2020-04, 2020-05, 2020-08, 2020-09.¹ In General Order 2020-04, the Court closed the Clerk's Office to the public and expressed the need to eliminate in-person court appearances, but then amended that order twice, reflecting the Court's gradual reopening. Upon review, the Court has determined it is in the interest of justice to maintain the practices enumerated below.

1) Documents that cannot be filed electronically via the electronic case management system (CM/ECF) may continue to be submitted by email in modification of LR IC 2-1. Las Vegas filings may be emailed to lv-public_docketing@nvd.uscourts.gov. Reno filings may be emailed to reno-public_docketing@nvd.uscourts.gov. In addition, pro se parties may consent to receive electronic notices of filing and/or delivery of documents by

2) The Court indefinitely extends the temporary suspension of LR IC 2-2(g); parties need not provide courtesy copies of electronically filed documents that exceed 50 pages in length.
