STANDING ORDER

WHEREAS in recognition of the coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic, and the associated restrictions placed on entry to courthouses in the District in order to protect the public health, the Court issued a Standing Order on March 18, 2020 (ECF Document No. 1), continuing all appearances for Violation Notices scheduled before this Court until further notice, finding specifically that a continuation of violation matters before the Court during this time could result in a significant miscarriage of justice,

WHEREAS restrictions on in-person gatherings imposed by the Governor of the State of New York have been eased and in-person court operations have gradually resumed permitting persons issued a Violation Notice to personally appear in court,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, effective March 1, 2021, the stay of appearances for Violation Notices is lifted.
