General Order No. 2021-10

GENERAL ORDER

This Order SUPPLEMENTS General Order 2020-05, General Order 2020-06, General Order 2020-07, General Order 2020-08, General Order 2020-10, General Order 2020-14B, General Order 2020-18, General Order 2020-20, General Order 2020-29, General Order 2020-32, General Order 2020-35, General Order 2020-39, General Order 2021-03, and General Order 2021-04. To the extent this Order differs from those Orders, this Order supersedes and replaces those Orders.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that based on the information available to date, including the estimated number of persons infected currently with COVID-19 and the number of cases projected to occur in the immediate future, the Court REAFFIRMS the following findings made in General Order 2020-05:

1. The gatherings of people in close proximity to one another that occur during Court operations presents the potential for substantial health risks to the public;
2. Such risks may be significantly mitigated by temporarily modifying Court operations; and
3. Good cause exists to implement temporary changes to Court operations.

Therefore, it is hereby ORDERED that the authorization for use of video teleconferencing, or telephone conferencing if video conferencing is not reasonably available, for the instances described in General Order 2020-08 is **EXTENDED** from March 17, 2021 until **June 14, 2021**, in all of the Court's divisions:

1. In criminal proceedings:
  - a. The United States District Court for the Northern District of Indiana resumed jury trials and reopened the Clerk's offices of the District to the public on March 1, 2021. However, the State of Indiana website coronavirus.in.gov as of March 9, 2021, at 11:59 p.m., shows the statewide positivity rate from 2/25/2021 until 3/3/2021 was 3.1% based upon all tests. The new deaths reported from February 7, 2021 until March 9, 2021, was 518. The 7-day all tests positivity rate for Lake

County was 4.13%, Jasper County was 5.3%, St. Joseph County was 2.77% and in Advisory Level Yellow, Elkhart County was 5.05% and in Advisory Level Yellow, Whitley County was 5.21% and in Advisory Level Yellow, and Allen County was 4.1% and in Advisory Level Yellow. More than half of the counties within the Northern District of Indiana remain at an Advisory Level of Yellow. In addition, the web site reports the moving average of statewide positive cases increased from 753 on March 4 to 812 on March 9. New cases reported statewide increased from 475 on March 7 to 861 on March 9. Moreover, the President of the United States notified Congress on February 24, 2021 that the pandemic continues to cause significant risk to the public health and safety of the nation and, on February 26, 2021, published formal notice in the Federal Register continuing the national emergency concerning COVID-19. The threat presented by COVID-19 and its spread remain very real concerns and continues to create exigent circumstances; therefore, the Chief Judge finds that felony pleas and felony sentencing cannot be conducted in person without seriously jeopardizing public health and safety. As such, the presiding judge should be given discretion in determining whether to conduct such matters in person.

- b. To the extent criminal proceedings may be conducted via phone or videoconference in accordance with General Order 2020-08 and Section 15002 of the CARES Act, in-person proceedings may be converted to telephonic or videoconference proceedings by the assigned District or Magistrate Judge after consultation with counsel. On a case-by-case basis and at the discretion of the assigned District or Magistrate Judge, criminal proceedings may be conducted in person after consultation with counsel and the United States Marshal Service.

General Orders 2020-07 and 2020-08 further address criminal proceedings held before the Magistrate Judges in light of the exigent circumstances created by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Chief Judge extends the authorization for use of video teleconferencing, or telephone conferencing if video conferencing is not reasonably available, for the instances described in General Order 2020-08 from March 17, 2021 until **June 14, 2021**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order is in effect until further order of the Court.
