Administrative Order Appointing the Federal Public Defender to Represent Defendants Requesting Early Termination of Supervised Release

District courts are authorized, under 18 U.S.C. § 3583, to terminate a defendant's term of supervised release at any time after the expiration of one year of supervision if the Court is satisfied that such action is warranted by the conduct of the defendant released and the interest of justice. To assist the Court in its consideration of motions for early termination of supervised release, the Federal Public Defender is appointed to consult with and represent any indigent defendant in the district of Kansas who meets the statutory qualifications to file such a motion. The FPD will alert the Court to any disqualifying conflicts and will obtain the consent of the defendant before filing any motion for early termination of supervised release.
