Re: <u>Supplement to Public Comment on Retroactivity</u>

Dear Judge Saris:

After we sent our public comment yesterday, the following further information about Percy Dillon's case was brought to our attention. His case is described at pp. 12-13 of the comments sent yesterday as one illustration of why excluding offenders with weapon enhancements would be unnecessary and unfair.

As noted, Mr. Dillon was convicted of using a firearm during and in relation to a drug trafficking crime. He received a mandatory consecutive 60-month sentence under 18 U.S.C. § 924(c) for this conviction. He was, however, never accused of using, carrying or possessing the gun and was neither present nor implicated in the incident described in the presentence report involving the gun. Jerron Lollis supplied the gun, Eric Williams stored the gun, and Malik Wade instructed Williams to bring the gun to Michelle Donahue's house, where Wade used the gun to threaten Donahue. Mr. Dillon was not present during or otherwise involved in this incident or even in the city when the gun was used. He was convicted of the § 924(c) solely under a *Pinkerton* theory, as the government acknowledged. *See United States v. Dillon*, Case No. 93-84 (W.D. Pa.), Docket # 143, Government's Response to Motion to Review Sentence at 6-7.
