The Federal Public Defender for the District of Puerto Rico seeks an exceptional attorney to join our Trial Unit. If you want to do the most important legal work of your career while living in one of the most beautiful places on earth, keep reading.

### **WHY THIS OFFICE IS DIFFERENT**

We're not a bureaucracy pretending to care about indigent defense. We're 50+ people who've chosen this work because we believe everyone deserves a fierce advocate, regardless of their bank account. Our 25+ attorneys range from brilliant lawyers fresh from clerkships to seasoned litigators, and we invest heavily in making everyone better through mentorship, training, and collaboration.

We don't cut corners. We use experts. We leverage technology. We employ three mitigation specialists and eight investigators because we know that excellent storytelling requires deep investigation. Our trials look different because we prepare differently. We don't practice in isolation, we brainstorm theories together, workshop suppression hearings as a team, and run mock trials. ### **THE PLACE**

### **WHAT YOU'LL ACTUALLY DO**

- Represent indigent defendants in federal criminal cases from arraignment through trial, sentencing, and postconviction litigation.
- Conduct client interviews, investigations, and legal research to develop defense strategies and support potential dispositive motions.
- Prepare for and conduct jury trials, including jury selection, opening statements, witness examination, and closing arguments.

- Collaborate with investigators, legal assistants, and experts.
- Participate in office training programs, case consultations, and professional development activities.
- Become the go-to expert on emerging areas of law and train your coworkers and fellow members of the defense bar.

#### **REQUIREMENTS & QUALIFICATIONS**

Applicants must have graduated from an accredited law school, be in good standing and admitted to practice before the highest court of a state, territory, or possession of the United States, and must be eligible to be admitted to practice before the First Circuit Court of Appeals and on motion (under local rule) to the U.S. District Court for the District of Puerto Rico. This position requires travel within Puerto Rico and within and outside of the United States.

#### **SELECTION CRITERIA**

The successful applicants will have solid legal research, writing, and oral advocacy skills and be committed to a team-based, client-focused approach to litigation. Applicants should have experience handling complex litigation and be able to undertake representation of clients at every stage of trial proceedings. Effective communication with clients, colleagues, staff, government, and court personnel is required. Applicants should also have a demonstrated interest in trial advocacy and an exceptional academic background. Federal judicial clerkship experience is desirable. Spanish-language proficiency is highly preferred.

#### **CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT**

Appointment to this position is contingent upon the successful completion of an FBI name and fingerprint check. Federal Public Defender employees are members of the judicial branch of the government and are considered "at will." This position is in the excepted service and does not carry the tenure rights of the competitive Civil Service. You must be a U.S. citizen or person authorized to work in the United States. Salary is payable only by Electronic Funds Transfer (direct deposit).

#### **SALARY AND BENEFITS**

Salary is commensurate with experience and qualifications within the guidelines set by the Judiciary Salary Scale for Assistant Federal Public Defenders. If hired, the private practice of law and notarial practice is prohibited. This position is full-time with a comprehensive benefits package that includes health and life insurance, vision and dental benefits, flexible spending accounts, paid time off, sick leave and paid leave for all federal holidays, and participation in the Federal Retirement System and Thrift Savings Plan (TSP with up to 5% government matching contributions).
