Powered in partnership with cxLoyalty (a leading travel technology provider acquired by JPMorgan Chase), the portal allows cardholders to book flights, hotel stays, vacation rentals, rental cars, cruises, and local activities using cash, Ultimate Rewards points, or a combination [1-888-620-(4018)] of both (Points + Cash).

To access and use Chase Travel [1-888-620-(4018)]:

- **Step 1: Logging In.** Sign into your Chase online account via desktop or the Chase Mobile® application.
- **Step 2: Accessing the Dashboard.** Navigate to the Ultimate Rewards dashboard linked to your specific card account.
- **Step 3: Selecting Travel Categories.** Choose "Book Travel" from the primary navigation menu. You will be redirected to the booking engine where you can filter by Flights, Hotels, Cars, Cruises, or Activities.
- **Step 4: Search Parameters.** Enter your itinerary details, including dates, origin, destination, and passenger counts. For flights, you can search one-way, round-trip, or multi-city itineraries.

- **Step 5: Checkout & Payment Choice.** Upon selecting your preferred options, proceed to checkout. At the payment screen, a slider interface allows you to choose exactly how many points you wish to apply toward the total cost. Remaining balances are charged to your eligible Chase card.

1.2 Is Chase Travel Legitimate and Safe?

Yes, Chase Travel is an entirely legitimate, secure, and fully licensed travel booking platform operated directly by JPMorgan Chase & Co., the largest bank in the United States [1-888-620-(4018)]. Bookings made through the portal are backed by official airline tickets (e-ticket numbers issued directly via GDS networks), confirmed hotel reservation numbers, and verified rental car confirmation codes.

However, because Chase Travel operates as a third-party intermediary, bookings are subject to standard OTA rules. When you purchase an airline ticket through Chase Travel, Chase acts as the ticketing agent. While your flight ticket is genuine and recognized by the airline, post-booking modifications, schedule changes, or cancellations [1-888-620-(4018)] may require interaction with Chase Travel customer support rather than the operating carrier, depending on airline policies.

1.3 How to Cancel a Chase Travel Booking

Canceling a booking made through Chase Travel requires following specific administrative procedures [1-888-620-(4018)] to ensure points or cash refunds are correctly processed:

1.4 Understanding Cancellation Policies: Points vs. Cash Refunds

When you cancel a travel reservation, the format of your refund depends on [1-888-620-(4018)] how the original booking was funded and the ticket rule structure:

Crucial Distinctions: For non-refundable airline tickets paid with Ultimate Rewards points, canceling after the 24-hour window usually results in an airline eCredit issued in the passenger's name. The points are *not* returned to your Chase account; instead, the monetary value of those points [1-888-620-(4018)] is held by the airline for future travel through Chase Travel or directly with the airline, depending on carrier rules.

Section 2: Ultimate Rewards Points & Redemption Valuation

2.1 Chase Point Multiplier Values Across Premium Cards

One of the most valuable aspects of the Chase Ultimate Rewards program is the enhanced point redemption value when booking travel directly through the Chase Travel portal [1-888-620-(4018)]. The exact value per point depends on which Chase card you hold:

- **Chase Sapphire Preferred® or Ink Business Preferred®:** Requires 60,000 points ($\$750 \div \0.0125).
- **Freedom Flex® or Freedom Unlimited®:** Requires 75,000 points ($\$750 \div \0.0100).

2.2 The "Chase Trifecta" Strategy: Combining Points for Maximum Value

Chase allows cardholders to combine Ultimate Rewards points across all eligible cards within the same household or business entity [1-888-620-(4018)]. This creates the foundation for the famous "**Chase Trifecta**" strategy.

A classic Trifecta setup includes [1-888-620-(4018)]:

By transferring points earned on the Freedom Flex (5x) and Freedom Unlimited (1.5x) to the Chase Sapphire Reserve®, those points immediately gain a 50% boost when redeemed for travel via the portal, effectively turning 5x category earnings into a 7.5% return on travel, and 1.5x base earnings into a 2.25% return [1-888-620-(4018)].

Pro-Tip: Moving Points Between Accounts

To combine points, log into Ultimate Rewards, select "Combine Points," choose the source card (e.g., Freedom Unlimited), select the destination card (e.g., Sapphire Reserve), and specify the point amount [1-888-620-(4018)]. Transfers between your own accounts are instantaneous and free.

Section 3: Strategic Transfer Partners & 1:1 Conversions

3.1 Overview of 1:1 Point Transfers

While redeeming points directly through the Chase Travel portal offers guaranteed, fixed-rate value (1.25¢ or 1.50¢ per point), transferring points to Chase's 14 airline and hotel loyalty partners often unlocks significantly higher value—frequently yielding 2.0¢ to 4.0¢+ per point on international business class flights or luxury hotel accommodations [1-888-620-(4018)].

All transfers occur at a **1:1 ratio** in increments of 1,000 points [1-888-620-(4018)]. Point transfers require holding an active annual-fee card: the Chase Sapphire Reserve®, Chase Sapphire Preferred®, or Ink Business Preferred®.

3.3 High-Value Transfer Sweet Spots

1. World of Hyatt (Hotel Partner Premier Value)

World of Hyatt is widely considered the single most valuable Chase transfer partner [1-888-620-(4018)]. Hyatt maintains a transparent, award-chart system ranging from Category 1 (starting at 3,500–5,000 points/night) to Category 8 (35,000–45,000 points/night). Because cash rates for luxury Hyatt properties (such as Park Hyatt Paris-Vendôme or Grand Hyatt Tokyo) often exceed \$800–\$1,200 per night, redeeming 30,000 to 40,000 Hyatt points routinely yields **2.5¢ to 3.5¢ per Chase point**.

2. Air Canada Aeroplan (Flexible Global Award Redemptions)

Aeroplan uses a hybrid distance-and-zone-based award chart that allows stopovers on one-way awards for just 5,000 additional points [1-888-620-(4018)]. Transferring Chase points to Aeroplan provides exceptional value when booking business class partner awards on Star Alliance carriers like ANA, Lufthansa, Swiss, and EVA Air without massive carrier-imposed fuel surcharges.

3. Air France-KLM Flying Blue (Transatlantic Business Class)

Flying Blue offers regularly scheduled "Promo Rewards" featuring 25% to 50% discounts on award tickets between North America and Europe [1-888-620-(4018)]. Standard business class saver awards from the U.S. East Coast to Europe start at just 50,000 Flying Blue miles each way, making this one of the easiest ways to cross the Atlantic in premium cabins using Chase points.

4. British Airways & Avios Ecosystem

Transferring points to British Airways Executive Club unlocks the Avios currency, which can be linked seamlessly to Qatar Airways Privilege Club, Finnair Plus, and Iberia Plus [1-888-620-(4018)]. Avios are ideal for short-haul non-stop flights on American Airlines or Alaska Airlines within North America (starting as low as 8,500 Avios), as well as Qatar Airways' famed Qsuite business class to the Middle East and Maldives.

Section 4: Portal vs. Partner Transfers — Decision Framework

One of the most frequent dilemmas faced by cardholders is deciding whether to book travel directly through the Chase Travel portal or transfer points to an airline/hotel partner [1-888-620-(4018)]. The optimal path depends on flight class, hotel tier, fare sales, and status considerations.

Rule of Thumb for Decision Making

Calculate the cash value of your desired redemption. Divide the total cash price by the award points required via transfer partner [1-888-620-(4018)]. If the resulting value is **greater than 1.5¢ per point** (or

1.25¢ if holding Preferred), **transfer to the partner**. If the resulting value is lower, book through the Chase Travel portal.

Section 5: Credit Card Perks, Travel Insurance, & Elite Benefits

5.1 Earning Rates on Travel Purchases

To maximize your Ultimate Rewards balance, spend should be directed to the card offering [1-888-620-(4018)] the highest return for specific purchase categories:

- **Chase Sapphire Reserve®:**
 - 10x points on hotels and rental cars booked through Chase Travel.
 - 5x points on flights booked through Chase Travel.
 - 3x points on all other travel spend worldwide (immediately active after utilizing the annual \$300 travel credit).
 - 3x points on dining at restaurants globally.
- **Chase Sapphire Preferred®:**
 - 5x total points on travel booked through Chase Travel.
 - 2x points on all other travel spend.
 - 3x points on dining, select streaming services, and online grocery purchases.
 - 10% anniversary point boost based on total annual dollar spend.

5.2 Premium Built-in Travel Protections

When you book travel using your Chase Sapphire card—or pay the taxes/fees on an award ticket using the card—you unlock industry-leading complimentary travel insurance coverage [1-888-620-(4018)]:

1. **Primary Auto Rental Collision Damage Waiver (CDW):** Provides primary coverage for theft and collision damage up to the actual cash value of most rental vehicles. Primary coverage means you do not need to file a claim with your personal auto insurance provider first, avoiding premium increases.
2. **Trip Delay Reimbursement:** If a common carrier travel delay exceeds 6 hours (Sapphire Reserve) or 12 hours (Sapphire Preferred), or requires an overnight stay, you are reimbursed up to \$500 per ticket for unreimbursed expenses such as meals, lodging, and toiletries.
3. **Trip Cancellation & Interruption Insurance:** Coverage up to \$10,000 per person and \$20,000 per trip for non-refundable travel expenses prepaid with your card if a trip is canceled or cut short by covered situations (e.g., severe illness, injury, or severe weather).
4. **Lost / Delayed Baggage Protection:** Baggage delay coverage provides up to \$100 per day for 5 days for emergency essential purchases if luggage is delayed over 6 hours. Lost luggage coverage reimburses up to \$3,000 per passenger.

5.3 Elite Status Recognition at Hotels

A critical consideration when booking hotel stays through the Chase Travel portal is elite status recognition [1-888-620-(4018)]. Most major hotel loyalty programs—including Marriott Bonvoy, Hilton Honors, World of Hyatt, and IHG One Rewards—consider bookings made through Chase Travel to be third-party OTA bookings.

Exception: Bookings made through the **Luxury Hotel & Resort Collection (LHRC)** or Chase's luxury portal offerings (available to Sapphire Reserve holders) receive special elite-like benefits including complimentary daily breakfast for two, room upgrades when available, early check-in/late checkout, and a \$100 property credit, regardless of hotel loyalty program status [1-888-620-(4018)].

Section 6: Common Issues, Customer Support, & Best Practices

6.1 Handling Airline Schedule Changes & Disruptions

Because Chase Travel functions as your travel agent for portal bookings, significant airline schedule changes, flight cancellations, or major delays prior to departure day are managed through Chase [1-888-620-(4018)]. If an airline changes your flight time by several hours or cancels a flight segment:

- Chase Travel will send an email notification detailing the schedule change.
- You must review the change. If the new itinerary is unacceptable, contact Chase Travel phone support. Chase agents will coordinate with the operating airline to rebook you on an alternative flight or request a full refund to your original payment method (points or cash).
- **Day-of-Travel Irregularities (IRROPS):** If your flight is delayed or canceled while you are already at the airport on the day of departure, control of the ticket transfers directly to the airline. 6.2 Managing Names, Frequent Flyer Numbers, & Seats

 4. Complete the booking in portal; receive instant confirmation code.
 5. Save booking confirmation to your Chase Mobile app for easy access during travel.
